OBJECT DESCRIPTION

Small silver plastic trophy. On the cup it is embellished with the Ahepan seal of Hermes' head, olive branches and a pheonix in flight. Around this symbol is written "XIII National Ahepan Olympiad-New York City." On the base of the trophy is a black plaque that reads "Pole Vault, 2nd Place- August, 1956, New York City"
