OBJECT DESCRIPTION

The man in the middle is wearing a suit and holding a hat in his hand. George Fraggos is wearing an apron and a button up shirt.

ORIGIN

Sugar Bowl was owned by George Fraggos, Andrew Pochos and George Callas. Their sons eventually took over the business. George Callas is father to donor. George Callas came from Adritsina, Greece to the United States in 1918 and he worked at the Sugar Bowl from 1920-1924 when the other two guys, George Fraggos and Andrew Pochos who are also from Andritsina, who owned it asked if he wanted to buy the third share. George married Staviani Metromaras and they have two children, Galine and Peter. In 1936 George told the other guys that they should move the candy store to another building and convert it into a cocktail lounge. They made the move in 1937, which was a risky time because of the depression but the business did well. The three men and their families grew up together and the sons went to work as soon as they could. When George and the other men decided to retire they let their sons buy the business from them but would not give it to them for free. In 1963 they celebrated the 50th Anniversary with all the families. Fraggos and Pochos died in 1964 and George Calla died in 1987.
