Runner

OBJECT DESCRIPTION

Table runners and matching doilies. The table runner looks like a rectangle with rounded corners and a semicircle at each end. In the semicircle, there is a pink and a red flower surrounded by stems and leaves. On each side of these flowers, there is a yellow flower whose stem leads to a bigger purple or blue flower. The thicker stems of the bigger flower lead to a small green stem with leaves, which in turn leads to two purple or blue flowers, which leads to a small green stem with three branches and leaves, which in turn leads to two pink flowers in the middle of the runner.

ORIGIN

Embroidery was originally used to reinforce seams, then it turned into a decorative art. It often marks a girl's transition into womanhood.
