OBJECT DESCRIPTION

This is a small figurine for either decorative or religious purpose. Depicts two sphinx figures with wings sitting on the top of a column or some type of architecture. The two figures are molded into one another.

ORIGIN

In Greek mythology, a sphinx is represented as a monster with a head of a woman, the body of a lioness, the wings of an eagle, and a serpent-headed tail. There was a single sphinx in Greek mythology, a unique demon of destruction and bad luck. The Sphinx is said to have guarded the entrance to the Greek city of Thebes, and to have asked a riddle of travellers to allow them passage.
