armed army. The leader, the communist and some others - at my  
myself, - are in prison or in exile. The remaining is a little group  
that is to live without problems. A good part of them are pro-war.  
We must admit it. The anti-yellow leadership with the anti-com-  
munist leadership and the great and many mistakes of  
the 23rd rulers have brought us to this - a terrible
