## **OBJECT DESCRIPTION**

A large wooden flask used for water or wine is a souvenir. Its main section is round (not perfectly circular) with circles engraved/lightly carved onto its belly. There is also carved on one side near the spout a Greek phrase and the year 1960 with four stars. The top has a stopper that is also wooden and is attached to the flask by a small piece of leather. There is a small pedestal-like element that is attached at the bottom. Leather elements serve as trimming-an X shape on either side of the flask's belly and two pieces that outline the roundness of the flask's sides. The leather elements are secured with brass-colored studs. There are also remnants of a leather strap for the flask to be worn on the body.

## **ORIGIN**

The flask's circular shape vaguely resembles the general forms and sometimes even carving designs of this particular flask. There does not appear to be a direct connection to a specific antecedent. The flask's rotund body recalls a canteen and its purposes rather than the flasks of popular culture. Regardless of whether it is a canteen or a flask, this item's primary purpose was to perform as a vessel for water or wine--though as a souvenir, this was likely more of a novelty item that served decoratively rather than functionally.
