OBJECT DESCRIPTION

Two pink satin pointe shoes made by Freed of London that once belonged to famous dancer Helene Alexopoulos. The right shoe is signed by the dancer in black ink. On the "sole" of the shoe is the makers mark "Freed of London Made in England" and under that the letter C. The shoes are size 6.5. Under the size is a gross and the Roman numerals XX.

ORIGIN

Helene Alexopoulos, a native of Chicago, began studying ballet with local teachers at the age of six. She continued her studies from the age of fourteen with former New York City Ballet Principal Dander Maria Tallchief, the director of the Chicago Lyric Opera Ballet, and while still a student appeared professionally with them. In 1977 Helene went to New York on a scholarship to study at the School of American Ballet, the official school of the New York City Ballet as a member of the Corps de Ballet, and was promoted to the rank of soloist in 1984, then to principal in 1989.

For her farewell performance in 2002, Helene danced the role of Siren in George Balanchine's The Prodigal Son, and the role of Merry Widow in Balanchine's Vienna Waltzes. Helene traveled extensively with the New York City Ballet, appearing with the Company in Tokyo, Osaka, Edinburgh, Copenhagen, Berlin, London, Paris, and many American cities. She continued to appear as a Guest Artist throughout the U.S. and Europe.
