Male figure, black hair & moustache, red fez with tassle, red "mole" on cheek, Green vest with yellow detail, white shirt, green pants with yellow/red/green/blue detail, red sash belt, red shoes, brown sword at hip and red fingernails



ORIGIN

Veligekas-Invented by Mimaros and is the policeman by the Pasha's side. He is a Turkish-Albanian. Generally seen as an enforcer, who hates theives.
