Male figure with black hair holding long beard, red and white hat with jointed black tassel, blue jacket with white shirt, red sash belt, white and red/black check pantaloons, blue tights and brown boots

ORIGIN

Haciavati-He is the poor, loyal friend of Karaghiozi. He often is beaten by Karaghiozi or Veligekas. He often facilitates getting Karaghiozi a job. He holds his beard and is usually the most Turkish looking.
