Male figure with black hair and moustache, green jacket and pants, brown detail and yellow epulets on jacket, yellow socks, brown pointed shoe, red tie belt, red/white/green hat, red fingernails, holding brown bottle?

ORIGIN

Sultan-Most likely the same as a Pasha or Bey. The Pashas were high ranking Turkish authorities and the Beys were rich merchants. They are comfortably rich and have many worries as part of the aristocracy.
